Ales Jenis is born in Bratislava, he studied singing and piano at the Conservatory in Bratislava. He won prizes and was finalist of many international competitions.

He was a member of National Theatre in <u>Bratislava</u>, where he was heard in roles such as Marcello/Schaunard, Belcore, Don Giovanni, Eugen Onegin, Riccardo, "Barbiere di Siviglia" Figaro, Silvio, Mercutio; furthermore, he sang in <u>Prague</u> the role of Don Giovanni and in "Le Rossignol", "Ariane" and "Gloriana".

First guest contracts brought him to <u>Wexford</u> Festival with "Die drei Pintos", to Grand Theatre <u>Genève</u>, Festival <u>Vienna</u>, <u>Amsterdam</u>, <u>Aix en Provence</u> with "House of the Death", to <u>St. Gallen</u> as Eugen Onegin and Don Giovanni, to <u>Santiago de Chile</u> as Heerrufer in "Lohengrin", to <u>Avignon</u> as Albert in "Werther", to <u>Montpellier</u> with "Il segreto di Susanna", to <u>Valencia</u> with "Betrothal in a Monastery", to <u>Glyndebourne</u> as Eugen Onegin, to <u>Tokyo</u> as Sharpless and to <u>Limoges</u> with "Italiana in Algeri".

He sang Sharpless in <u>Santiago</u> <u>de</u> <u>Chile</u>, "Nozze di Figaro" Count in Valencia, "House of the Death" at <u>Met New York</u>, at Staatsoper <u>Berlin</u> and at <u>Scala Milano</u>, Eugen Onegin at Bolshoi Theatre in <u>Moscow</u>, Thoas in "Iphigenie en Tauride" in <u>Budapest</u>, Marcello in <u>Limoges</u> and Germont in <u>Graz</u>.

Recent and future engagements through the 2025/26 season include "Nozze di Figaro" Count, Don Giovanni, "Iolantha", "Le Rossignol" in <u>Prague</u>, Don Giovanni in <u>Lodz</u>, Marcello, Eugen Onegin, "Barbiere di Siviglia" Figaro, Silvio, Amonasro in <u>Bratislava</u>, Germont in <u>Vienna</u>, Don Giovanni, Germont and "Das Wunder der Heliane" at Reisopera <u>Enschede</u>, "House of the Death" at Covent Garden <u>London</u>, <u>Paris</u>, <u>Brussels</u>, <u>Lyon</u>, <u>Met</u> and <u>Rome</u>, Marcello in <u>Wuppertal</u>, Silvio at Festival <u>Bergen</u>, Nabucco in <u>Ostrava</u> and <u>Brno</u>, Schaunard at Festival <u>Klosterneuburg</u> / Vienna and at Covent Garden <u>London</u>.

His concert experience includes performances of Orff's "Carmina Burana" at Konzerthaus <u>Dortmund</u> and with Orchestre National de <u>Lille</u>, Dvorak's Biblical Songs with the Finnish Radio Symphony Orchestra <u>Helsinki</u>, Martinů's Gilgamesh with the <u>Prague</u> Philharmonia Orchestra.
