

## **Timothy RICHARDS** Tenor

The Welsh tenor Timothy Richards studied at the Royal Welsh College of Music and was later awarded an entrance scholarship to the Royal Northern College of Music, Manchester. He won the Towyn Roberts Scholarship at the Royal National Eisteddfod of Wales.

He made his professional operatic debut as Alfredo in "Traviata" for Welsh National Opera in **Cardiff**, followed by contracts in **Basel**, **Innsbruck** and **Oslo**.

Since his debut at Semperoper **Dresden** as Italian Tenor in "Rosenkavalier" and Rodolfo in "Boheme" he appeared in the leading tenor roles like Rodolfo, "Rigoletto" Duke, Riccardo, Pinkerton, Cavaradossi, Luigi, Don José, Hoffmann, Werther at Staatsoper **Berlin**, Gran Teatre del Liceu **Barcelona**, National Opera **Oslo**, Royal Danish Opera **Copenhagen**, Grand Opera **Poznan**, **Glyndebourne** Opera, ENO **London** Colliseum, Staatsoper **Leipzig**, Staatsoper **Stuttgart**, the **Spoletto** Festival in Italy.

He was heard as Erik in **Saarbrücken**, as Don José and Prinz in "Rusalka" in **Berlin**, as Riccardo in **Magdeburg**, as Pinkerton in **London**, as Prince in "Rusalka" in **Wiesbaden**, as Hoffmann in **Perm** and as Pinkerton in **Wuppertal**. Further he sang Werther in **Chemnitz**, Riccardo and Erik in **Magdeburg**, Pollione in **Prague**, 9<sup>o</sup> Beethoven and Walter in "Loreley" in **St. Gallen**, a recital in **Stuttgart**, Verdi Requiem in **Hamburg**, 1<sup>o</sup> Geharnischer and Erik at Gran Teatro del Liceu in **Barcelona**, Riccardo in **Mannheim**, Hoffmann in **Perm**, "Zauberflöte" in **Paris** and Calaf in Busoni's "Turandot" in **Cagliari**.
