

Katerina TRETYAKOVA Soprano

Katerina Tretyakova is born in Murmansk in Russia, at the age of 15 she began studying the Art of Conducting at the conservatory in Vilnius, which she completed with honours. She continued her studies at the Mozarteum Salzburg and completed her master's degree studies with Josef Wallnig and Elisabeth Wilke, being awarded the highest distinction.

2013 she won the prestigious Francisco Vinas Competition in Barcelona, one of the most important in the world, and in summer 2013 she was awarded first prize at the international competition Grand Prix de l'Opéra in Bucharest, second prize at the Montserrat Caballé International Singing Competition in Zaragoza and first prize at the Marcello Giordani International Vocal Competition in Catania.

Till 2018 she was a member of the ensemble of Staatsoper **Hamburg** singing roles like Lucia di Lammermoor, Gilda, Adina, Adele, Oscar, Susanna, Pamina, Musetta, Valencienne, Nanetta and Gretel.

She sang at Festival **Salzburg** Hyacinthus in Mozart's "Apollo and Hyacinthus", at Theater an der Wien in **Vienna** in Hindemith's "Mathis der Maler" and in Marschner's "Hans Heiling", as a concert soloist with the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra in **Amsterdam**, the **Montpellier** Radio Orchestra, the **Dresden** Philharmonic, the **Hamburg** Philharmonic and at Konzerthaus **Vienna**. She was heard as Violetta in "Traviata" in **Nuremberg**, with "Mathis der Maler" at Enescu Festival in **Bucharest**, as Violetta in **Vilnius**, as Gilda in **Bogota**, with concerts in **Spain**, **Italy**, **Germany** and **Panama**, as Lucia at Staatsoper **Hamburg** and as Juliette in "Romeo et Juliette" in **Graz**.

Recent and future contracts until 2022/23 include Musetta, Lucia, Susanna, Gretel and Adina in **Hamburg**, "Parsifal" at Staatsoper **Berlin**, Juliette and Donna Anna in **Graz**, Traviata in **Vilnius**, Oscar, Juliette and Musette at Teatro Liceu in **Barcelona**, Regina in "Mathis der Maler" in **Bucharest**, Anna in "Hans Heiling" in **Essen**, Musette in **Seoul**, Juliette in **Valladolid**, Traviata and Juliette in **Düsseldorf**, Traviata at Staatsoper **Berlin** and Faure Requien in **London**.
