Bartosz Urbanowicz is born in Rzeszów, Poland, where he began his musical education at the Music School of Rzeszów. He graduated with highest honors from the Karol Szymanowski Academy of Music in Katowice.

At the age of 23 he made his stage debut as Warlaam in “Boris Godunov” in **Wroclaw**.

He performed in Poland Leporello, Sparafucile and Verdi Requiem.

He moved to Germany to become member of the National Theatre **Mannheim**. There he sings roles such as Don Magnifico, Don Bartolo, Don Pasquale, Raimondo, Oroveso, Seneca, Ramfis, Dulcamara, Un Frate, Don Alfonso, Leporello, Ferrando, Monterone, Tom, Colline, Biterolf, Titirel, Nachtwächter, Kaspar, Gremin, King René in “Iolantha”, Tschelio in “L'amour des trois oranges”, Lanceotto Malatesta in “Francesca da Rimini”, Dr. Vigelius in “Der ferne Klang”, and Hidulfus in “Genoveva”.
