Simon Schnorr is born in Munich, he received his first musical education at the Tölzer Knabenchor singing at major European opera houses and concert halls with conductors such as <u>Claudio Abbado</u>, <u>Daniel Barenboim</u>, Sir <u>Georg Solti</u>, <u>Zubin Mehta</u>, <u>James Levine</u> and <u>Nikolaus Harnoncourt</u>.
