

## **Daniel GUTMANN** Baritone

The Austrian baritone Daniel Gutmann studied singing at the Vienna University of Music and the Performing Arts with Julia Bauer-Huppmann. In addition, the young baritone is a graduate in Sports Studies from the University of Vienna and works as manager and front man in his country band “The Groovecake Factory”, with whom he won the “Rising Star Award” at the “Texas Sounds International Country Music Award” in Jefferson/Texas (USA).

2021 he won the 2° price in Elina Garanca’s competition “Zukunftsstimmen”.

He made his opera debut as Don Alfonso in “Così fan tutte” at the Salzkammergut Festival in **Gmunden**.

Recent and future engagements through the 2025/26 season include Schönbrunn Palace Theatre in **Vienna** as Leporello, Buonafede in “Il mondo della luna” and Mozart Figaro, **Salzburg** Festival with Gottfried von Einem’s “Der Prozess”, Konzerthaus **Vienna** with Bernstein’s “Mass”, **Baden**/Vienna with Leo Fall’s operetta “Die Kaiserin”, **Jennersdorf** as Buonafede in “Il mondo della luna”, in **Zurich** with the leading role in Stephen Storace’s opera “Gli Equivoci”, **Toulouse** with “Barbiere di Siviglia”, **St. Gallen** with “Les Misérables”, Musikverein **Vienna** with Mozart Mass C minor, Festival **Erl** with “Matthäus Passion”, **Nuremberg** as Dandini, **New York** with Schumann concerts, **Tokyo** with “Nozze di Figaro” and Wiener Opernsommer **Vienna** as Escamillo.

He is member of the ensemble of the Staatstheater am Gärtnerplatz in **Munich** singing roles such as Dandini, Papageno, Falke, Schaunard, Josef in “Wiener Blut”, Freddy in “My Fair Lady”, Mann mit dem Maulesel in “Die Kluge”, Don Giovanni and Figaro in “Barbiere di Siviglia”.

A significant proportion of Daniel Gutmann’s artistic creativity is also devoted to concert recitals and songs. Having grown up with choral music, he started his career as a soloist at an early stage. Concert trips took him as far afield as **New York**, **Singapore**, **Washington D.C.** and the eastern USA. Moreover, he gave a number of recitals in Austria.
