Guido JENTJENS Bass

Guido Jentjens was born in Geldern/Niederrhein. At the same time of his final school examination he made his exam in church music and worked as organist and choir leader. He finalized his studies of singing with Prof. Claudio Nicolai in Cologne and attended master courses with Kurt Moll, Ernst Haefliger, Josef Greindl, Andreas Schmidt and Josef Metternich, who has been coaching him till today. Furthermore Guido Jentjens participated often at the "Münchner Singschule".

He was engaged at the opera houses in <u>Düsseldorf</u>, <u>Augsburg</u>, <u>Erfurt</u> and Staatstheater in <u>Karlsruhe</u>, where he sang all popular roles of the bass- and bass-baritone repertoire. Wolfgang Wagner and Christian Thielemann engaged him for several years as Pogner in "Meistersinger von Nürnberg" to the <u>Festival Bayreuth</u>, followed by further invitations for "Tannhäuser" Landgraf. He was member of the Staatstheater <u>Wiesbaden</u>, where he sang the major parts of the German and Italian repertoire, but also Boris Godunov.
