Tigran MARTIROSSIAN Bass

Tigran Martirossian was born in Erevan, Armenia, where he first studied physics before taking up his vocal training at the Gnesin State Academy of Music in Moscow. During his studies he was hired as a soloist to the "New Opera" <u>Moscow</u> followed by an engagement as soloist at the <u>Moscow</u> Bolshoi Theatre, where he sang many main bass roles.

He sang his first Philipp at the opera house in <u>Sofia</u> and was heard in many productions of "Boris Godunov", so at the Festival of <u>Salzburg</u>, conducted by Mo. <u>Gergiev</u>, as Pimen in <u>Graz</u>, as Warlaam in <u>Frankfurt</u> and in <u>Toulouse</u> under Mo. <u>Plasson</u>, he returned to <u>Salzburg</u> for a concert performance and for "Les Troyens", both with Mo. <u>Cambreling</u>.
