Nancy WEISSBACH Soprano

Nancy Weißbach is born in Berlin, her first musical education started in her home town, then she studied at the Music College "Franz Liszt" in Weimar and at the Royal Conservatory in Den Haag with Cristina Deutekom and Diane Forlano. She participated at master classes at the Britten-Pears-School for Advanced Musical Studies, in Aldeburgh with Galina Wischnewskaja, the Scuola Civica in Milan (Rodolfo Celletti), the Gregynog Festival in Great Britain, at the Belgian Plais De Beaux Arts with Vera Roza and at the Belcanto Festival in Dordrecht and the György Festival in Den Haag.

She took part successfully at several voice competitions like "Prix Jeunesse" in Amsterdam and received a scholar ship at the Belcanto Festival in Milan and the Bayreuth scholar ship from the Richard Wagner organization in Amsterdam. Her first contracts were for the role of Dido in a production of "Dido and Aeneas" at the festival d'**Ambronay**, a role she sang in seven more French theatres, and for Santuzza and Marschallin in "Rosenkavalier" in **Meiningen**, since then she has worked as freelance artist.

Important guest contracts include Chrysothemis in an "Elektra" production of <u>Stéphane Braunschweig</u> in <u>Strasbourg</u>, a role she sang then also at Théâtre Royal de la Monnaie in <u>Brussels</u> with Mo. <u>Kazushi Ono</u>, and in a production of <u>Ruth Berghaus</u> at Nationaltheater in <u>Mannheim</u>, she was heard as Gutrune and 3° Norne at Théâtre du Capitol in <u>Toulouse</u> with Mo. <u>Pinchas Steinberg</u> and the stage direction by <u>Nicolas Joel</u>.
