Eugenia Dushina was born in Moscow, she began to study at the College of the Moscow Conservatory and continued with a post graduate study at the University of Music and Dramatic Art in Vienna.

She then took part in master classes with G. Taddei in Italy and won prizes at voice competitions in Russia and Georgia.

She was heard in concerts in Germany, Spain, at Mozarteum in **Salzburg** and at the Liszt Hall in **Budapest**.

She sang several opera productions in Russia as well as Tatiana in "Eugen Onegin" in **Beijing**, the title role in "Coq d'Or" at Théâtre Champs Elysées in **Paris** and Rosalinde in "Fledermaus" at Schlosstheater Schönbrunn in **Vienna**.

She was heard as Nedda in "Pagliacci" at Festival <u>Klosterneuburg</u>/Vienna, as Alice Ford in "Falstaff", Donna Elvira and Tatiana at Schlosstheater in Schönbrunn in <u>Vienna</u> and as Fevronia in "The Legend of the Invisible City of Kitezh" at Opera <u>Bergen</u>.
